## 2012 AMERICAN DANCE FESTIVAL

**Week 3 includes World Premiere by Monica Bill Barnes & Company,  
3 World Premieres by Pilobolus featuring collaborations with  
Sidi Larbi Cherkaoui and Michael Moschen,  
and the International Screendance Festival**

**Durham, NC, June 13, 2012 – The American Dance Festival (ADF)** continues its tradition of supporting the creation of new work and presenting their debuts. During the third week of the ADF Season, four world premieres, including three ADF commissions, will take the stage. **Monica Bill Barnes & Company** will present an ADF commissioned world premiere, along with some of her celebrated repertoire at Reynolds Industries Theater **Sunday-Tuesday, July 1-3**. As one of the most anticipated companies each summer, **Pilobolus** will present 3 world premieres, including 2 ADF commissions in collaboration with renowned juggler Michael Moschen and Belgian choreographer Sidi Larbi Cherkaoui, **Thursday-Saturday, July 5-7** at DPAC. Additionally, they will present a **Children’s Saturday Matinee on July 7** at DPAC. The 17th annual **International Screendance Festival** will wrap up this exciting week of modern dance from **Friday-Sunday, July 6-8** at the Nasher Museum of Art and White Lecture Hall at Duke University.

### **Monica Bill Barnes & Company Sunday, July 1-Tuesday, July 3 Reynolds Industries Theater**

Described as “one of the wittiest young choreographers around,” **Monica Bill Barnes** returns to Durham for her company’s first solo concert on the ADF stage. Her all female company has been celebrated for its hilarious works that celebrate the joys of individuality, comedy, and the idea that “all the world’s a stage.” They will perform an ADF commissioned world premiere entitled *Luster*, a duet between Barnes and longtime collaborator, Anna Bass. They will also present *Mostly Fanfare* (2010), a poignant and intoxicating examination of the hardships of life on stage inspired by the beauty and mystery of vaudeville and silent films, and *Everything Is Getting Better All the Time* (2010), a work that explodes with heart and tenacity as four women, dressed in men’s suits, take an inquisitive look into the complexities of their characters’ relationships.

**Pilobolus****Thursday, July 5 and Saturday, July 7****Durham Performing Arts Center**

Year after year **Pilobolus** brings audiences brilliant and thought-provoking works full of imagination, wit, and choreography that put audiences on the edge of their seats. Along with some of their timeless repertory, they will present three world premieres, including 2 ADF commissions, that feature unique collaborations. Working with MacArthur “Genius” and award-winning master juggler Michael Moschen, *Azimuth* turns the art and act of juggling into an investigation of a geometrical universe where gravity defying dancers must find harmony with the celestial machine. Their second premiere features a partnership with internationally renowned Belgian choreographer Sidi Larbi Cherkaoui. This cyborg of dance takes place in a mirrored world between *Tron* and *Metropolis* and examines the penetrating and emotional journey through a time that is seemingly yet to come. Collaborating once again with Trish Sei (co-creator of last year’s Grammy-nominated *All Is Not Lost*), Pilobolus will present the world premiere of *Skyscrapers*, a work that combines street dance and tango for a journey of love and loss in the streets of Eastside LA. The company will also perform *Sweet Purgatory* (1991), originally commissioned by the ADF for the company’s 20th anniversary, and *The Transformation* (2009), an excerpt from one of their shadow dances.

**ADDITIONAL FESTIVAL ACTIVITIES**

The ADF will host a one-hour **Saturday Children’s Matinee** on **July 7** at 1 pm with a performance by **Pilobolus**. The hour-long, family friendly performance is specially designed to ignite the imaginations of children, and will include an interactive segment. Immediately following the performance, audience members are invited for a free Kids Party on the DPAC Plaza, complete with snacks, activities, face painting, and live music. **Friday-Sunday, July 6-8** the ADF will present the 17th annual **International Screendance Festival**, directed and curated by Emmy nominated director Douglas Rosenberg. The festival will feature chosen films that explore the dynamic and continually evolving relationship between cinematography and dance. All screenings take place at White Lecture Hall and Nasher Museum of Art at Duke University.
